Visit the iconic Burj Khalifa and enjoy the panoramic view from the observation deck (ticket included). In Bastakia, stop to admire the old wind-tower houses built by wealthy merchants. Close by stands the 150-year-old Al Fahidi Fort, which houses the Dubai Museum. Cross the creek by abra, the local water taxi, and visit the gold and spice souks (market places). Remainder of the day free. (B)

Day 4 - Abu Dhabi

From Dubai, travel past the world's largest manmade port at Jebel Ali on a two-hour drive through coastal desert scenery studded with acacia trees. Arrive in Abu Dhabi, capital of the United Arab Emirates. Visit the Heritage village, ancient Al Husn Fort, Abu Dhabi Cultural Foundation, the old dhow yard and charming Batinah harbor. Return to Dubai in the evening. (B)



Day 5 - Dubai

For a magical evening, leave behind the bustle of the city in the afternoon, as a four-wheel-drive vehicle takes you on a thrilling journey over rolling dunes, deep into the heart of the desert. Stop to see camels, and, from the crest of a high dune, watch the sun cast its orange glow over the rippling sand. A traditional Arabian welcome awaits you. EGYPT NILE CRUISE

9 DAYS/8 NIGHTS

Cairo, Luxor, Nile Cruise, Edfu, Aswan



Day 1, Friday - Arrive Cairo

Arrive in Cairo, where you are met and transferred to your hotel. (Steigenberger Pyramids/Cairo Marriott)

Day 2, Saturday - Cairo

This morning, meet your Egyptologist and head to Giza Plateau, where you marvel at the sight of the three great pyramids of Giza. Afterward, head to the Step Pyramid at Saqqara. Then continue with a visit to Memphis, the ancient capital founded by the pharaoh Mense. Statues and architectural fragments have been collected in the sculpture garden, which occupies part of the Ptah Temple complex. The massive statue of Ramses II lies under a roof, and the Sphinx from the same period dominates the courtyard. (B)

Day 3, Sunday – Cairo

A full day of touring begins with a visit to the Egyptian Museum, located in the heart of Cairo. The museum houses the world's most important collection of Egyptian antiquities, dating from 2700 BC to the 6th century AD. Admire the amazing treasures of the young king, Tutankhamun, including his famous mask made out of solid gold and in a perfect state of preservation. In the afternoon, continue to the Citadel, which dominates Cairo from its high vantage point on the Mokattam Hills. The heart of the city for more than 200 years beginning in 1176, the Citadel was erected by Salah El Din, the legendary Saladin who conquered the Crusaders in Palestine. The complex also contains palaces and mosques that were built later. The tour highlight is the great Mosque of Mohammed Aly, which was built imitating the Blue Mosque of Istanbul. This evening, tour Khan El Khalili, Cairo's largest and oldest bazaar, built in 1382. Today, it is Cairo's tourist bazaar. It is an exotic and rewarding experience, where bargaining is the name of the game. (B)

Day 4, Monday - Cairo/Luxor/Nile Cruise

Today, transfer to the airport and fly to Luxor. On arrival, transfer to the pier and embark on a four-night Nile cruise. Afternoon sightseeing along the East Bank features the magnificent temples of Karnak and Luxor. Karnak surpasses every other temple in the ancient world. The Temple of Luxor was built over several centuries by Amenhotep III, Tutankhamun, Ramses II and Alexander the Great. It is a graceful piece of architecture preceded by an avenue of sphinxes. (MS Iberotel Crown Empress/MS Farah Nile Cruise) (B/L/D)

Day 5, Tuesday - Nile Cruise

Early this morning, visit three sites on the West Bank of Luxor: the Valley of the Kings, the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, and the Colossi of Memnon. In the Valley of the

Kings, 62 pharaohs, including Tutankhamun, were buried in rock-cut tombs. Continue to the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, which rises out of the desert plain in a series of terraces, is one of the finest monuments of ancient Egypt. The Colossi of Memnon, a massive pair of faceless statues, are all that remain of the temple of the hedonistic Amenhotep III. After the tour, sail to Esna and overnight on board. (B/L/D)

Day 6, Wednesday - Nile Cruise

Today, cruise through the luxuriant Nile to Edfu and visit the Temple of Horus. Having escaped destruction from floods, this huge complex is Egypt's most completely preserved

temple. Continue sailing to Kom Ombo and visit an unusual double temple dedicated to Sobek and Horus. Sail to Aswan and overnight on board. (B/L/D)

Day 7, Thursday - Nile Cruise

This morning, begin visiting Aswan at Philae Temple on the island of Agilika. The romantic and majestic aura surrounding the temple complex of Isis has been luring pilgrims for thousands of years. The temple was in danger of being submerged with the construction of the new Aswan dam. The Egyptian government and UNESCO worked together to relocate the entire temple, stone by stone, to the island where it stands today. The water contained by the controversial High Dam has backed up nearly 310 miles, taking it well into the Sudan and creating Lake Nasser, the world's largest artificial lake. Enjoy sunset on the Nile in Aswan as you sail around Elephantine Island and visit the famous Botanical Gardens. (B/L/D)

Day 8, Friday – Aswan/Cairo

Disembark after breakfast. Transfer to the airport for your flight to Cairo. On arrival, transfer to your hotel. (Holiday Inn City/InterContinental Citystars) (B)

Day 9, Saturday – Depart Cairo

Transfer to the airport for your departure flight. (B)

Day 1, Saturday - Arrive Amman

Arrive in Amman, Jordan's capital city, where you are met and transferred to your hotel. (Sparr/Mena Tyche/Landmark)

Day 2, Sunday - Amman

After breakfast, begin a full-day tour with a visit to the Desert Castles. Their fine mosaics, frescoes, and stone and stucco carvings illustrate 8th-century life. Tour Jordan's modern capital, Amman, known as the "white city." Visit the Citadel, which houses the Temple of Hercules, the Umayyad Palace and a Byzantine church. At the foot of the Citadel lies the 6,000-seat Roman Theatre, carved into the hill. Also, visit the Jordan Archaeological Museum and the Folklore Museum. (B)

Day 3, Monday - Pella and Umm Qays

After breakfast, a full-day of sightseeing begins with Pella. Besides excavated ruins from the Greco-Roman period, see the remains of a Chalcolithic settlement from 4 BC, evidence of Bronze and Iron Age walled cities, Byzantine churches, early Islamic residential quarters and a small medieval mosque. Gadara (now Umm Qays) and Pella were ancient Greek cities in eastern Palestine. Perched on a hilltop overlooking the Jordan Valley and the Sea of Galilee, Umm Qays boasts a stunning black basalt theatre, the basilica and adjacent courtyard strewn with nicely carved black sarcophagi, the colonnaded main street and a side street lined with shops. (B)

Day 4, Tuesday - Jerash/Dead Sea

Today, take a full-day tour of Jerash. "The Jewel of the North," Jerash, dating back more than 6,500 years, is one of the largest and most well-preserved sites of Roman architecture in the world outside Italy. Continue to the Dead Sea. (B)

Day 5, Wednesday - Amman/Madaba/Mount Nebo/Ker-ak/Petra

After breakfast, drive along the 2,000-year-old Kingsway Road to Madaba, "The City of Mosaics." Visit the Greek Orthodox Church of St. George, where there is a famous 6th-century Byzantine mosaic map of the Holy Land. Proceed to Mount Nebo, burial place of the Prophet Moses, with a spectacular view of the Holy Land. Continue driving, via the Kings Highway, and arrive at Kerak, the magnificent 12th-century Crusader castle located on a hilltop. Proceed to Petra for overnight. (Amra Palace/Old Village/Movenpick Nabatean) (B)

Day 6, Thursday - Petra


After breakfast, begin a full-day visit of the "Rose Red City" of Petra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Enjoy a walk or a short horse ride from Petra's main entrance to the entrance of the old city through the "Siq," a 1,150-foot-long narrow canyon. At the end of the Siq stands the famous Treasury monument, Al Khazneh. (B)

Day 7, Friday - Petra/Al-Beidha/Wadi Rum/Amman

After breakfast, drive just ten minutes to Al-Beidha, known as Little Petra. Enter the site through a narrow 380-yard-long gorge. As in Petra, buildings were carved into the sandstone, used as residences, storage areas and tombs. In one of the buildings you can find the remains of painted frescoes dating back to the 1st century. Continue to Wadi Rum, Jordan's vast and echoing desert, for a 4x4 jeep ride. Return to Amman for overnight. (Sparr/Mena Tyche/Landmark)) (B)

Day 8, Saturday - Depart Amman

After breakfast, transfer to the airport and board your departure flight. (B)







MOROCCO'S IMPERIAL CITIES

Day 1 - Arrive Casablanca

Arrive in Casablanca. You are transferred to the city for a brief sightseeing tour that includes the old French quarter of Habous, outside the Hassan II Grand Mosque, a showcase of the very best Moroccan artisanship. Continue to your hotel for dinner and overnight. (Odyssee/Le Palace d'Anfa) (D)

Day 2 - Casablanca/Rabat/Fes

After breakfast, depart overland toward the imperial city of Rabat, driving along the highway that links this capital city and Casablanca. Embark on a city tour that highlights Rabat's cultural influences and the superbly preserved relics of its Moorish past, including Hassan Tower; the mausoleum dedicated to Mohamed V, grandfather of the current king; and Oudaya Kasbah and its delightful Moroccan garden. Afterward, continue overland to Fes (approx. 3 hrs' drive). Dinner and overnight. (L'Escale/Les Merinides) (B/D)

Day 3 - Fes

Today, step back in time with a visit to Fez el Bali (Old Fez), the cultural heart of Morocco. Explore some of the 9,000 narrow lanes, alleys and souks that make up the labyrinth of the city's old quarter. The imperial capital was a renowned center of medieval learning. Visit the Nejjarine Square and the Fondouq (Caravanserai), a museum dedicated to the wooden arts and crafts of Morocco. The medieval Medina (Fez el-Bali) is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Also, visit Fez el-Jedid (New Fez), built in the 13th century and home to the Mellah (Jewish quarter). Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

Day 4 – Volubilis & Meknes

Today's excursion begins with a journey overland (approx. 1 hr 40 min) to explore the Roman ruins of Volubilis, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that is home to some of North Africa's best-preserved Roman ruins. Continue to Meknes, another World Heritage Site and one of Morocco's imperial cities. Meknes is replete with fantastic historical sites, from minarets to museums, to enormous mosaic doors and royal golf courses. Among the most popular attractions are the Mausoleum of Moulay Ismail, the Nejjardine Mosque and Grand Mosque (outside visit). Return to Fes for an evening at leisure. Dinner and overnight at the hotel. (B/D)

Day 5 – Fes/Ifrane/Beni Mellal/Marrakech

Transfer to Marrakech. Today's journey (approx. eight hours) takes you toward the Middle Atlas Mountains through Imouzzer, an authentic Berber village, and Ifrane, where you will enjoy the flower-lined paths and the



Day 1, Friday – Arrive Reykjavik

Arrive in Reykjavik, Iceland's capital, and transfer on your own to your hotel. (Icelandair Natura)

Day 2, Saturday – Volcano Crater, Seals, Fjords and Mountains (264 miles)

Begin your tour by coach, traveling westward. Pass Borgarnes, and climb Grabrok volcano crater. Afternoon, visit a natural history museum and stroll around the harbor. Further north, stop at the turf church of Vidimyri. Continue along the fjord landscape over several mountain passes to Akureyri. (Icelandair Akureyri) (B)

Day 3, Sunday – Akureyri, Lake Myvatn and Geothermal Baths (75 miles)

In the morning explore the town of Akureyri. Visit the botanical garden and enjoy the view over Eyjafjordur fjord. Afternoon, travel to Godafoss (waterfalls of the gods). Continue to Lake Myvatn, known for its geological wonders. Stop at the bizarre lava formations at Kalfastrond, walk around the pseudo craters, and end the day with a relaxing soak at Myvatn Nature Baths. (Sel-Hotel Myvatn or similar) (B)

Day 4, Monday – Lava Labyrinth, Hot Springs and Vatnajokull National Park (155 miles)

Morning hike in a lava labyrinth at Dimmuborgir, a dramatic expanse of lava steeped in folklore. After an optional lunch, visit the hot spring area of Namaskard. Then head to East Iceland and your hotel in Egilsstadir. You might spot an Arctic fox or reindeer. Jun-Aug: Tour includes a detour to Dettifoss, Europe's most powerful waterfall, in Vatnajokull National Park. (Icelandair Herad, Oct-Apr; Guesthouse Alfheimar in Borgarfjordur-Eystri, May-Sep) (B)

Day 5, Tuesday – East Fjords (161 miles)

A day to admire the dramatic fjord landscape and its tiny fishing villages at the end of twisty roads in the East Fjords. En route, visit Petra's fascinating rock collection. A naturalist who collected rocks for nearly eighty years in East Iceland, Petra amassed a unique treasure, now beautifully laid out in her home and garden and proudly cared for by her descendants. Afternoon, see Vatnajokull, Europe's biggest glacier, visible all over Southeast Iceland. Overnight in the town of Hofn. (Hofn) (B)

<u>Possibility of seeing the Northern Lights during the evening</u> from October to mid-April.

Day 6, Wednesday – Vatnajokull Glacier, Glacier Lagoon, Diamond Beach, South Coast – 236 miles

Today, travel along the southern part of the glacier Vatnajokull and spend some time at Europe's second largest national park. Stop and explore at Jokulsarlon, a glacial lagoon filled with floating icebergs. Walk on the Diamond 8 DAYS/7 NIGHTS

Reykjavik, Akureyri, Valnajokull National Park, Thingvellir National Park, and Volcanoes, Hot Springs, Fjords, Glaciers and Waterfalls

Beach, a black sandy beach where large icebergs often get stranded. Afternoon, a beautiful drive with many natural wonders awaits as you head across the Eldhraun lava field. Cross the sandy desert of the South Coast, overlooked by rugged cliffs, glaciers, and waterfalls. See the Reynisfjara shore, near Vik, widely regarded as Iceland's most impressive black sand and pebble beach; and out in the sea, the spectacularly shaped basalt sea stacks, Reynisdrangar. In the small village of Skogar, view the 62-meter-high Skogafoss waterfall. Further west, stop at Seljalandsfoss waterfall, which plunges over the mountain. (Eyjafjallajokull or similar) (B)

Possibility of seeing the Northern Lights during the evening from October to mid-April.

Day 7, Thursday – Iceland Horses and Golden Circle (99 miles)

Today, travel the route of the Golden Circle sights. Start the day at Fridheimar, where you learn about the Icelandic horse and visit a geothermal greenhouse. Later, see steam from the Geysir geothermal fields, where there is a variety of hot springs and bubbling pools, and Strokkur erupts at 5-10 minute intervals. Continue to Gullfoss, the golden falls, a double waterfall that tumbles 112 feet into the Hvíta river. Travel inland to Thingvellir National Park, a World Heritage site. Back in Reykjavík, a short city tour includes highlights of the world's northernmost capital. (Icelandair Natura) (B)

Day 8, Friday - Depart Reykjavik (31 miles)

Transfer to the airport on your own for your homeward-bound flight. (B)

Note: From September to May, in rare cases a change of itinerary might be necessary, especially for winter programs in Iceland, because of snow, road and weather conditions. Reasonable alternatives will be arranged wherever and whenever possible

The train ride travels through endless Russian landscapes along the River Volga. Late afternoon, arrive in Moscow and transfer to hotel. (Hotel Azimut Smolenskaya or similar). (B)

Day 5, Saturday - Moscow

Moscow, the Mother of Russia, is a genuine Russian city with the Kremlin and its onion-domed cathedrals. The dramatic changes over the last decade have made the city one of the world's most dynamic metropolises. Morning sightseeing tour features highlights of the vast city, including Red Square with St. Basil's Cathedral, Theatre Square with the Bolshoi Theatre, and Sparrow Hills with Moscow University. Remainder of the day, explore the city on your own or book optional tours for the afternoon and evening. (B)

Day 6, Sunday - Moscow

After breakfast, explore the city at your leisure, or book an optional full-day excursion. (B)

Day 7, Monday - Depart Moscow

Transfer on your own to the airport for your departure flight. (B)

Day 1, Sunday - Arrive Vilnius

Arrive in Vilnius, the capital of Lithuania, and transfer on your own to your hotel. (Radisson Blu Lietuva or similar)

Day 2, Monday - Vilnius

Vilnius is known for its more than 1,200 medieval buildings and 48 churches. After breakfast, the morning panoramic tour of the city includes a walking tour of the Old Town. (B)

Day 3, Tuesday – Vilnius/Riga

After breakfast, depart for Riga. The first stop is the Hill of Crosses. After crossing into Latvia, reach the magnificent Rundale Palace. After a guided tour, travel through the rolling hills of southern Latvia. Reach Riga in late afternoon and check in at your hotel. (Wellton Riverside or similar)

Day 4, Wednesday - Riga

The largest of the three Baltic capitals, Riga boasts a kaleidoscope of architectural styles. A morning walking tour of the Old Town includes Riga Castle, the Dome Cathedral, St. Peter's Church, and more. (B)

Day 5, Thursday - Riga

Breakfast at the hotel. Day at leisure to explore Latvia on your own or take optional tours. (B)

Day 6, Friday - Riga/Tallinn

The tour continues today along the coastal highway to the Estonian summer resort of Parnu. Continue through the North Estonian land of forests and arrive in Tallinn. (Hotel Radisson Blu Olympia or similar)

Day 7, Saturday - Tallinn

Tallinn, Estonia's capital, is a charming blend of medieval tranquility and modern urban life. The medieval Old Town is a busy place in the summer with its many shops, galleries, souvenir markets, outdoor cafes and restaurants. Morning tour takes you around the old medieval city walls and into the Old Town. (B)

Day 8, Sunday - Tallinn/Helsinki

Breakfast at the hotel. Time at leisure until the ferry to Helsinki, or take an optional tour to Lahemaa National Park. Take the ferry to Helsinki and enjoy a refreshing tour through the Finnish archipelago. Upon arrival in Helsinki, transfer to hotel. (Hotel Glo Art or similar) (B)

Day 9, Monday - Helsinki

Helsinki's location at the crossroads of Western and Eastern culture is reflected everywhere in the green and lively Finnish capital. Morning sightseeing tour around the harbors and the Senate Square, up central Mannerheim Street and by the Parliament Building, Finlandia Hall, and the Sibelius Monument, and visit the famous Church-in-the-Rock. (B)

Transfer on your own to the airport for your departure flight. (B)

WONDERS OF ROMANIA ESCORTED COACH

Day 1 - Arrive Bucharest

Arrive in Bucharest, capital of Romania. You are met and transferred to your hotel. (Novotel or similar) (D)

Day 2 - Bucharest/Curtea de Arges/Sibiel

After breakfast, depart for Curtea de Arges, former capital of Wallachia. Visit the Episcopal Church where the Romanian kings are buried. Drive along the picturesque Olt Valley to Sibiu, one of the oldest cities in Transylvania. Guided walking tour of the medieval town includes the Main Square, the Evangelical Church, and the Liars' Bridge. Depart for Sibiel, where you visit the Museum of Icons. Overnight in Sibiel. (Popa Reghina Guesthouse or similar) (B/L/D)

Day 3 - Sibiel/Sighisoara/Bistrita

Morning, depart to Sighisoara, birthplace of Vlad the Impaler. En route, visit the UNESCO-protected fortified Church at Biertan. Arrive at Sighisoara and discover the medieval Citadel (a UNESCO World Heritage site), the Clock Tower, the Church on the Hill, and the roofed stairways. After lunch, continue to Targu Mures, with a walking tour through the city center, known for its architecture (the Palace of Culture, the Orthodox churches, and the Teleki-Bolyai Library). Drive on to Bistrita, one of the seven medieval cities in Transylvania (and the place where Jonathan Harker, Bram Stoker's hero, spent the night), before arriving at Dracula's Castle. (Coroana de Aur or similar) (B/L/D)

Day 4 - Bistrita/Campulung Moldevenesc/Gura Himorului

Depart for Bucovina, the "upper land," which features unique painted monasteries that belong to the UNESCO World Heritage. After crossing the land of Dracula, arrive at Campulung Moldovenesc and visit the Wooden Art Museum. After lunch, visit the Moldovita Monastery, a medieval art treasure. Visit the workshop of Lucia Condrea, the famous creator of painted eggs, and the village of Vatra Moldovitei, with its traditional small houses, old steam train, and unspoiled nature. (Popas Turistic Bucovina or similar) (B/L/D)

Day 5 - Gura Humorului/Brasov

Today, visit Bucovina's Voronet Monastery, the jewel of Bucovina, known as "the Sistine Chapel of the East."

Continue the drive through the Moldavian villages, with their typical houses. Arrive at the village of Tarpesti, home of the "Neculai Popa" Museum. Afterward, visit the monastery of Agapia. Afternoon, cross the Bicaz Gorges on foot, weather permitting. Arrive at Lacu Rosu (the Red Lake) for a lunch of typical Romanian "gulas." Continue to Brasov, former Kronstadt, founded by the Saxon colonists, as the south gate of Transylvania. Walking tour through the old town center includes the Black Church, the biggest Gothic church between Istanbul and Vienna. (Hotel Coroana Brasovului or similar) (B/L)

Day 6 - Brasov

Breakfast at hotel. Travel in and around Brasov. Stopover at

Prejmer for a visit to the fortified church, another World Heritage site. Drive on to Bran and visit the famous medieval castle (Dracula's Castle) built as a fortress for the citizens of Brasov in 1377 as a defense to the city. Lunch in Bran. Return to Brasov. (B/L)

Day 7 - Brasov/Bucharest

In the morning, cross the Carpathians toward Sinaia, a scenic mountain resort known as the "the Pearl of the Carpathians." Visit Peles Castle, an exquisite piece of architecture that is one of Europe's most spectacular castles. Travel to Bucharest in time for lunch. On a panoramic city tour, visit the House of Parliament, Europe's largest build-

ing, and take a walking tour in the Old City center. Evening farewell dinner. (Novotel or similar) (B/L/D)

Day 8 - Depart Bucharest

After breakfast, time at leisure depending on your departure flight. Transfer to the airport for your return flight. Or, take the Danube Delta Extension. (B)

Day 8 - Bucharest/Danube Delta

Early morning, depart for Tulcea. After lunch, visit the Danube Delta Museum, before departing by boat to Crisan/Sulina. Check into your accommodations in the area, where you have a traditional fish meal. (B/L/D)

Day 9 - Danube Delta

After breakfast, depart for the south lakes of Sulina to enjoy the Danube Delta. After a three-hour journey, return to Sulina for lunch. Afternoon, visit the town, museum, old churches and the cemetery. See the picturesque Sulina beach and seaside where the water is not salty, and have a few hours at leisure. Return after sunset and have a traditional dinner based on fresh fish. Route is decided each day by the guide, depending on water levels of the Danube and the weather. (B/L/D)

Day 10 - Danube Delta

After breakfast, depart by boat for Letea Village, with its many traditional houses. En route, go through the Gulf of Musura to see K Island, a paradise for birds. Arrive at a point for traveling by safari car to Letea Forest, the northernmost subtropical forest in Europe. See local attractions, including the famous wild horses, walk in the fine sand, and head back to the boat and to Crisan/Sulina. Visit a local farm in Cardon, where lunch is prepared by your hosts. Evening farewell dinner. (B/L/D)

Day 11 - Danube Delta/Bucharest

Early or packed breakfast before departing for Tulcea. Transfer to Bucharest and check in to your hotel (not included) or at the airport for your onward flight. (B)

Day 1 - Arrive Istanbul

Arrival in Istanbul, where you are met and transferred to your hotel in the center of the city. Rest and refresh at your hotel. (Antik/Marmara Pera)

Day 2 - Istanbul

After breakfast at the hotel, meet your guide and set out on a full-day walking tour that covers the city's highlights, including its most historic section, Sultanahmet. First, visit the Hippodrome, which was once the social center of Constantinople (the city's Byzantine name). Later, continue with a visit to the Blue Mosque, one of the world's most important temples, named for the blue Iznik tile work that decorates its interior. Next, visit the Topkapi Palace, the Imperial residence of twenty-five Ottoman sultans. After lunch, visit the Hagia Sophia, center of the Eastern Orthodox Church for more than nine centuries. It contains some of the finest mosaics from the Byzantine period. Complete the tour at the Grand Bazaar, an enormous labyrinth of covered streets lined with thousands of shops. Return to hotel at the end of the tour. (B/L)

Day 3 – Istanbul

Morning tour includes a visit to the famous 17th-century Spice Market, also called the Egyptian Bazaar. Continue with your guide to Eminonu to board a local boat for a cruise up the Bosphorus toward the Black Sea (about 1-1/2 hours). The cruise is one of the most unforgettable excursions between Europe and Asia. Along the way, see historic palaces, as well as mansions and modern villas that form the elegant section of the city. Afternoon at leisure. (B)

Day 4 - Istanbul/Kayseri or Nevsehir/Cappadocia

This morning, you are transferred to the airport for your flight to Kayseri or Nevsehir. Upon arrival, your driver meets you for transfer (about 1 hr) to Cappadocia, famous for its cone-shaped geological formations. After lunch, visit one of Cappadocia's underground cities, which were cut out of volcanic rock between the 6th and 10th centuries. The labyrinth of tunnels was used by the local population for hiding when invading armies were passing through. Later, see the Pigeon Valley, where, for centuries, the locals kept pigeons in niches carved in the rock. You may also be able to climb the rock-carved Uchisar Castle and enjoy breathtaking views over the valley. Check into your unique cave hotel in Cappadocia. (Dinler Urgup/Alfina Cave) (B/L)

Day 5 - Cappadocia

This morning, begin a day of touring in Goreme National Park, a World Heritage Site. See the amazing rock formations in Dervent Valley. Then visit Zelve Valley, the oldest example of Cappadocian architecture, where elaborate shelters were carved into the rock. Nearby is Pasabag, also known as Monk's Valley, which has examples of hermitages hollowed out of volcanic rock formations. After lunch, visit the village of Avanos, on the banks of the river Kızıl Irmak, Turkey's longest river. Stop at a ceramic cooperative and learn about production of Turkish ceramics. Continue on to the Goreme Open-Air Museum, which contains the finest of the rock-cut churches. Then visit the Goreme Valley, the

valley of churches, where beautiful primitive frescoes cover the church walls. Later, you have a chance to visit some local villages and craftspeople. (B/L)

Day 6 - Cappadocia/Izmir/Kusadasi

After breakfast, you are transferred to the Kayseri airport for your flight to Istanbul, which connects with your flight to Izmir. You are met at the Izmir airport and transferred to your hotel in Kusadasi. Rest of the day at your leisure. (Ilayda Avantgarde/La Vista) (B)

Day 7 - Ephesus

Today's excursion takes you to the ancient city of Ephesus, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Its renowned ruins are

among the most extensive in the world. In its heyday, Ephesus rivaled Rome in its splendor. The Temple of Artemis is one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. After lunch at a local restaurant, visit the neighboring pastoral village of Sirince. In 1924, in the massive population exchanges between Greece and Turkey, Muslims from Salonica resettled here, creating a farming community highly adept at

winemaking. Apple wine is a local specialty. Return to your

hotel in Kusadasi. (B/L)

In the morning, a drive of about 1-1/2 hours takes you to Izmir International Airport, where you board a short flight to Istanbul. Connect with your departure flight from Istanbul. (B)

Day 2 - Oslo


This morning, your city tour includes a guided walk through the Vigeland Sculpture Park. See the world-renowned collection of works by Norwegian sculptor Gustav Vigeland. Continue to the famous Holmenkollen Ski Jump for a photo stop and to enjoy the view from one of the city's finest vantage points. Next, take a coach tour through the center of the city, as your guide provides information about the city's history and culture and its major attractions, such as Akershus Castle and Fortress and the Royal Palace Park (Slottsparken). Remainder of the day at leisure. (B)

Day 3 - Oslo/Myrdal/Flam (train)

After breakfast at the hotel, depart from Oslo by train. The journey from Oslo to Myrdal is part of the Oslo-Bergen railway, one of the finest train journeys in the world. In Myrdal, change to the Flam Railway, which passes through wild mountain scenery with breathtaking waterfalls and steep mountainsides and down to the Sognefjord and the village of Flam. (Fretheim/Flamsbrygga) (B)

Day 4 - Flam/Gudvangen/Bergen (train-boat-bus)

Today, travel by boat to Gudvangen on the Naeroyfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Continue by bus through Naeroyfjord Valley and up the winding Stalheimskleiva road. The last part of the excursion is by train from Voss to Bergen, Norway's second largest city. (Grand Terminus/Clarion Haynekontoret) (B)

Day 5 - Bergen

Day 1 - Arrive Copenhagen

Arrive in Copenhagen, Denmark's charming capital city, and transfer to hotel on your own. (Comfort Vesterbro/The Square)

Day 2 - Copenhagen

After breakfast, discover the city this morning on your guided coach tour.
