

GALAPAGOS ISLAND HOPPING

Day 1, Saturday - Miami/Guayaquil

Depart Miami via Avianca Airlines flight to Guayaquil. On arrival, transfer to hotel. (Wyndham Garden)

Day 2 - Sunday - Guayaquil/Santa Cruz, Galapagos

Today, transfer to airport for flight to the Galapagos Islands. Arrive in Baltra and take a shuttle to Santa Cruz island, journeying across the island into the highlands. Beginning at the coast and traveling north along the road to Puerto Ayora, the road climbs through the agricultural zone and into the mist-covered forests of the highlands. Santa Cruz possesses all of the various life zones present on the archipelago, with wonderful birding opportunities. Whether it's the bright red feathers of a vermilion flycatcher or one of Darwin's finches, almost every land bird present on the islands can be found here. Stop at one of the ranches for lunch and to explore the grounds in search of tortoises. After lunch, continue to Puerto Ayora for some leisure time this afternoon. (Fiesta/Acacia) (B/L)

Day 3, Monday - Santa Cruz/Floreana

After breakfast, take a speed boat to Floreana island (about 2-1/2 hours). Floreana was the first island to be colonized by Ecuadorians in 1832. Arriving on the island, visit a local farm and learn about the Floreana lifestyle. Also, visit a lagoon where it is possible to observe frigate birds. After lunch, prepared with foods harvested from the farm, continue to Asilo de la Paz, a 45-minute ride from town, where you can view a pirates' cave and the fresh water spring. Along the path, see giant tortoises, a species that has been recently re-introduced after being considered extinct. This evening have a barbecue on the beach and enjoy the peacefulness of Floreana. (Santa Maria) (B/L/D)

Day 4, Tuesday - Floreana/Isabela

Begin the day with an excursion to La Loberia, a sea lion

breeding area. Take a short walk along the shore after the interpretation and view the landscape of this visitor's site. Then start a marine excursion in the bright turquoise water, where you might be able to swim with sea lions, sea turtles, manta rays and a variety of colorful coral fish. After lunch, take the speed boat to Isabela island (about 2-1/2 hours) and have a chance to enjoy the island on your own. (Volcano/Casa de Marita) (B/L)

Day 5, Wednesday - Isabela

After breakfast, travel by car to the mountainsides of Sierra Negra Volcano. Then walk (about 2 hours) to reach the crater of the volcano, where you may see the Galapagos sparrow hawk. Become familiar with the geology of the volcano. After a box lunch, return to the town. Afternoon, visit the Tintoreras Islet, a short distance from Puerto Villamil, home to a great variety of wildlife. Its waters are inhabited by white-tipped reef sharks, Galapagos penguins, marine turtles and sea lions. One of its beaches, surrounded by mangroves, is one of the few sites where marine iguanas can reproduce successfully. (B/L)

7 DAYS/6 NIGHTS

▶ Guayaquil, Santa Cruz, Floreana, Isabela

Day 6, Thursday - Isabela/Santa Cruz

After breakfast, start out for the Flamingo Lagoon. Along the trail (about 1.2 miles), learn about the vegetation and geology of Isabela island. Arriving at the lagoon, you may see flamingos feeding in the lake. Continue on to visit the Tortoise Breeding Center, where you learn more about the reproduction and breeding of the tortoises. Back at Puerto Villamil, take a boat to Santa Cruz Island. On arrival, head to the Charles Darwin Station. The center is a fount of information on habitats and local conservation. At the Tortoise Breeding Center, it is possible to view tortoises of different shapes and sizes. Travelers here can freely walk and get their pictures taken with the tortoises. (Fiesta/Acacia) (B)

Day 7, Friday - Santa Cruz/Guayaquil/Miami

After breakfast, briefly visit Los Gemelos, two large pit craters along the road from Puerto Ayora to Baltra. Afterward, transfer to the airport for your international flight back to Miami via Guayaquil. (B)

FASCINATING PERU



Day 1 - Miami/Lima

Depart Miami via Avianca Airlines for Lima. Arrive and transfer to your hotel. (Casa Andina Select Miraflores/JW Marriott)

Day 2 - Lima/Cuzco

Fly to Cuzco and transfer to hotel. Afternoon tour of Cuzco includes the Imperial City, a living example of the mixture of Andean and Spanish cultures. Visit Santo Domingo Convent, built over the Koricancha, an ancient Inca palace and temple of the Sun God. Stop at the Main Square, visit

Sacsayhuaman Fortress and view archaeological sites. (Novotel/JW Marriott)(B)

Day 3 - Machu Picchu

Travel by train to Machu Picchu, fabled "Lost City of the Incas." En route, view the Sacred Valley of Urubamba. Arrive in Aguas Calientes and board the bus to the citadel for a guided tour. Return to Cuzco by train. (B/L)

Day 4 - Sacred Valley

In the morning, discover the best of the Sacred Valley of the Incas, starting in Chinchero at Inca's Balcony, a textile art center with an impressive view. Here, twelve families, who still preserve their traditional costumes, show you the ancestral way in which they process the wool and obtain vivid colors for their textiles. Afterward, visit Ollantaytambo, a monumental architectural complex of the ancient Inca Empire. (B/L)

Day 5 - Cuzco/Lima

Fly to Lima and transfer to your hotel. Afternoon tour includes the Main Square, 16th-century San Francisco

2 DAYS/1 NIGHTS

▶ Ica (Flyover), Paracas Bay, Ballestas Islands

Day 1 - Lima/Ica (Flyover)

Transfer from Lima bus station to take the coach to Ica (approx. 4 hrs). Upon arrival, check in at the hotel. Transfer to the local airport to board a light aircraft and fly over the mysterious Nasca Lines, a World Heritage Site. Spot figures drawn on the sandy soil. Representing animals and stylized plants, these figures have been preserved for almost 2,000 years. Rest of the day at leisure, or take an optional city tour. (La Hacienda Bahia Paracas/Hotel Paracas)

Day 2 - Paracas/Ballestas Islands/Lima

Travel to Paracas Bay, where you take a two-hour motorboard excursion to the Ballestas Islands, the biggest natural sanctuary along Peru's shoreline. During the excursion, note a mysterious design called "El Candelario." Return by bus to Lima. (B)

Day 1 - Miami/Buenos Aires

Depart Miami in the evening via Avianca Airlines for Buenos Aires.

Day 2 - Buenos Aires

Arrive in Buenos Aires and transfer to hotel. (Kenton Palace/Recoleta Grand)

Day 3 - Buenos Aires

Morning city tour includes the Obelisco; the famous squares Plaza de Mayo, Alvear and Plaza del Congreso; avenues Corrientes, Mayo and 9 de Julio; historic neighborhoods; and commercial and financial districts. Afternoon free. (B)

Day 4 - Buenos Aires

After breakfast, a day at leisure. This evening, dinner and tango show in a traditional "tangueria." (B/D)

Day 5 - Buenos Aires/Bariloche

After breakfast, fly to Bariloche, in the foothills of the Andes. Arrive and transfer to hotel. (Edelweiss/Llao Llao)

Day 6 - Bariloche

Begin a half-day scenic excursion, mainly along the coast of Lake Nahuel Huapi. Stop at Bonita Beach en route to Mount Campanario, taking a chairlift to the peak. Continue to Llao Llao Peninsula and Puerto Panuelo. Cross the bridge over Lake Moreno and follow the coast of Trebol Lagoon back to the city. (B)

Day 7 - Bariloche/Peulla

Transfer by bus to Puerto Panuelo. Board a launch and sail Lake Nahuel Huapi to begin Argentina-Chile lake crossing. Arrive in Puerto Blest. Proceed by bus to Puerto Alegre. Board another launch and sail Lake Frias to Puerto Frias. After Argentine customs, continue by bus, crossing the border into Chile over Perez Rosales Pass. Arrive in Peulla. Transfer to hotel. (Natura) (B/D)

Day 8 - Peulla/Puerto Varas

After breakfast, transfer to the pier to board a launch and cruise the spectacular Lake Todos Los Santos. After a two-hour journey, arrive in Petrohue to end lake crossing. Then travel by bus, stopping in Vicente Perez Rosales National Park for breathtaking views of Osorno Volcano and

Llanquihue Lake. Transfer to Puerto Varas. (Cabana del Lago) (B)

Day 9 - Puerto Varas/Puerto Montt/Santiago

After breakfast, a day at leisure. Transfer to airport at Puerto Montt for flight to Santiago. Arrive and transfer to hotel. (Plaza el Bosque Nueva Las Condes/Sheraton) (B)

Day 10 - Santiago

Morning city tour begins with a walking tour downtown, including Plaza de Armas and Ahumada Boulevard. By vehicle, visit old Santiago's main avenues and drive up San Cristobal Hill for a panoramic view. Continue to the modern part of the city. Afternoon free. (B)

Families demonstrate the ancestral way in which they process the wool and obtain vivid colors. Afterward, visit Ollantaytambo, a monumental architectural complex of the ancient Inca Empire. 

beach, site of two beautiful ahu (stone platforms) with moai. You may take an ocean swim before your afternoon return to Hanga Roa. (B/L) $\,$

Full-day tour of the Great Uyuni Salt Lake. Start with a visit

to a local handicraft salt factory in Colchani. Visit Isla Pescado, famous for its giant cactus and fauna. Lunch at Isla Pescado. Return to Uyuni. (B/L)

Day 8, Thursday - Salar de Uyuni/La Paz

Fly to La Paz and transfer to your hotel. (Presidente/Europa) (B)

Day 9, Friday - La Paz






